PICTURE BOOKS

E Auch - *The Princess and the Pizza*

An out-of-work princess applies to become the bride of Prince Drupert, but first she must pass several tests, including a cooking contest.

E Ross - *I Want My Dinner*

After a little princess learns to say "please" and "thank you," she teaches the same etiquette to a Beastie.

E Isadora - *The Princess and the Pea*

A simplified version of the tale in which a girl proves that she is a real princess by feeling a pea through twenty mattresses and twenty featherbeds.

E Lester - *Princess Penelope's Parrot*

An arrogant and greedy princess's chances with a handsome prince are ruined when her parrot repeats to him all the rude comments the princess has made.

E Martin - *The Storytelling Princess*

Having survived a shipwreck, a princess tries to tell a prince a story ending he does not know and thus qualify for his hand in marriage.

E Shields - *I am Really a Princess*

A child imagines herself a princess and contrasts her everyday life with the one she could have in a castle with infinitely permissive parents.

E Caldecott Thurber - *Many Moons*

Though many try, only the court jester is able to fulfill Princess Lenore's wish for the moon.

E Posner - *Princess Fidgety Feet*

Princess Bridget can't seem to keep still. Her feet want to run and skip and hop. Most of all, her feet want to play soccer! But kicking balls isn't proper behavior for a princess, so she has to keep her soccer games a secret.

E Kleven - *The Paper Princess*

A little girl makes a picture of a princess that comes to life and is carried off by the wind.

E Tyler - *Tumble Tower*

A very messy princess in a very tidy royal family has the opportunity to prove that there are advantages to not being neat.

E Reader 3 Blair - *The frog prince : a Retelling of Grimms' Fairy Tale*

A retelling of the classic tale of a beautiful princess who makes a promise to a frog which she does not intend to keep.

E Reader 3 Hooks - *The Monster from the Sea*

A determined princess, whose father's policy of keeping strangers off their island kingdom has made her curious about the outside world, finally gets her wish to meet someone new.

J Comics Enchanted - *Enchanted*

Giselle leaves the magical world of Andalusia and finds her true love in New York City.

J Comics Disney - *Cinderella III: a Twist in Time*

The evil stepmother conjures up a spell that reverses all of which the fairy godmother did.

J PB Sage - *Magyk*

After learning that she is the Princess, Jenna is whisked from her home and carried toward safety by the Extraordinary Wizard, those she always believed were her father and brother, and a young guard known only as Boy 412--pursued by agents of those who killed her mother ten years earlier.

J Cabot - *Princess in Pink*

In a series of humorous diary entries, high school freshman (and Genovian Princess) Mia tries to get her reluctant boyfriend to take her to the prom.

J Royal - *Elisabeth: the Princess Bride*

The diary of Princess Elisabeth, written in 1853-1854, describing her engagement and marriage to Franz Joseph I, Emperor of Austria.

J Harrison - *The Princess and the Hound*

George has always felt burdened by his princely duties, and even more by the need to hide the magic through which he speaks with animals, but when he is betrothed to the strange princess of a neighboring kingdom, his secret, and the persecution of people like himself, must come to an end.

J 2008 Caudill Shelf Hale - *Princess Academy*

While attending a strict academy for potential princesses with the other girls from her mountain village, fourteen-year-old Miri discovers unexpected talents and connections to her homeland.
